Booster Club Scholarship eligibility:

Each graduating senior <u>must</u>:

- Attend at least 50% of the meetings of his/her 4-H club.
- Complete at least one project in 4-H during his/her senior year.
- Turn in a recordbook according to the following schedule:
 - -Must have turned in a completed recordbook as a sophomore and as a junior.
- -Must turn in a completed project record form on a project or a completed recordbook for their senior year along with the scholarship application. A completed copy of the 4-H Opportunity Scholarship may be used instead of a project record form or completed 4-H recordbook.
- Must plan to attend a college, university, technical school or enlist in the military the following year. A copy of military enlistment papers must be submitted before the scholarship check is issued.
- Review and consideration will be given to new county residents actively involved in 4-H.
- Each 4-H member or parent must help with at least one fundraiser per year and a parent will be required to attend at least one Booster Club meeting per year, beginning in their freshman year.
- Seniors and/or parents must attend a Booster meeting between August - April meeting to qualify.

RCFA Reminders

- The October Meeting will be October 21st, 2019 at 7pm at Padilla.
- A parent and/or child must help with one Fair Association fundraiser or event approved by the Fair Association Board member. Failure to comply with this policy will result in a one-time \$100 per family fee. (Rule #4, pg. 5 RCFA Rule Book).

- Any exhibitor determined ineligible for extracurricular activities according to the school's enforcement of the Texas Education Code is ineligible to show. The exhibitor and animal are both ineligible.

If you plan on showing a livestock project or competing in a contest at a major livestock show in the spring: (Fort Worth, San Antonio, San Angelo, Houston, Austin, Odessa)
You must come to major show sign up day and submit paperwork and payment.

Quality Counts



If you are new to 4-H or changed age divisions, (ex: Junior to Intermediate) and plan to show livestock at Refugio County Fair or a Major Livestock Show, you must complete quality counts again. QC must be completed to sign up for major livestock shows on Oct 30th.

QUALITY COUNTS ENROLLMENT

Before getting started: For the best experience in the Quality Counts course, please use Mozilla Firefox as your internet source (Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, and Safari may work in some instances but are NOT suggested). Also, please make sure your browser (Firefox) has JavaScript and Cookies enabled. For desktop computers, you must have Adobe Flash Player 10.1 or greater installed.

We recommend using Firefox as your browser!

- Go to: https://www.texaslivestockvalidation.com/qc/qcregister.aspx
- 2. Register with your information
 - a. It is very important to choose BOTH your 4-H and FFA chapter regardless of which you think you will show through!
 - b. You will need to enter your DOB and Phone Number in the format provided.
 - c. For grade level, please enter the grade you are entering (if between May-August) or your current grade, depending on the time of year you are registering in Quality Counts.
- 3. Click Submit Registration
- 4. This will trigger an email from dottle.goebel@ag.tamu.edu to keep for your records.
 - Do not delete this email as it contains a Return Link that you will NEED to come back to the course at any time.
- 5. Staying on the website, click Proceed to Curriculum.
- 6. You will be directed to the Quality Counts curriculum website.
- The course is free, so click the green Enroll Now button.
 - You may have to scroll down to see this if using a mobile device.
 - b. Though you do have to create another login on a separate website, this is necessary to be able to leave and come back to the curriculum as many times as needed!
- Click <u>Register</u> under "Are You a New Learner?" Even if you created an account last year
 and are enrolling in a new grade category, you need to create a new account. This is
 because we transitioned websites for improvements.
- Create username and password and complete login details. The address entered is not used or saved and is only for this site.
- Accept the terms and conditions and click Register.
- 11. Click "Click Here" under Course Access Details.
- 12. Click Quality Counts
- Select Age Bracket according to your school grade as of August 31 of the current year.
- 14. Begin Course! The course will take approximately 2 hours to complete.
- 15. You may leave and come back to the course using the Return Link (Step 4a).
- 16. Once you complete the course, you will click Proceed to Test.
- 17. You must complete the exam once you start it, but you can take it as many times as needed to achieve an 80% or higher.
- 18. Once passed, your verified Quality Counts number is ready for livestock show entries!


Fashion & Interior Pashion Workshop Design Workshop

Crossroads

Event Information

4-H Crossroads is a three day/two night career development and youth leadership program to involve 8th - 12th grade youth in various projects that will expose them to various career and higher education opportunities. Register on 4-H Connect.

Crossroads Workshops:

There will be four offered at Crossroads this year. All educational tracks are being hosted by the Texas A&M University - Kingsville. When registering, all youth need to select which track they prefer to attend. All tracks are guaranteed to be hands on.

The tracks are:

- Plant Science/ General Ag: Learn about various aspects of Plant Science including entomology and soil science. Also visit with professors about General Agriculture Science degree options.
- Animal Science: Learn about courses offered through the Animal Science department, as well as careers associated with that degree. Have hands on experiences in cattle reproduction, ruminant nutrition, and more.
- Wildlife Sciences: Explore Caesar Kleberg Wildlife center, learning about research being conducted at Texas A&M Kingsville, and practice various wildlife management techniques.
- Vet Science: Tour the Vet technologist school at Kingsville, you will get to see the teaching facility, practice skills, and learn about what Vet Technologist are.



Registration will be from September 9, 2019 to October 11, 2019. The cost for Crossroads is \$175.00 for 4-H members and \$175.00 for adult leaders and County Extension Agents. A late fee of \$25.00 will be assessed from October 12, 2019 – November 1, 2019 for youth participants. Late registrants may not receive a t-shirt.
